

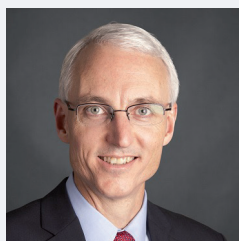

INVESTMENT OBJECTIVE

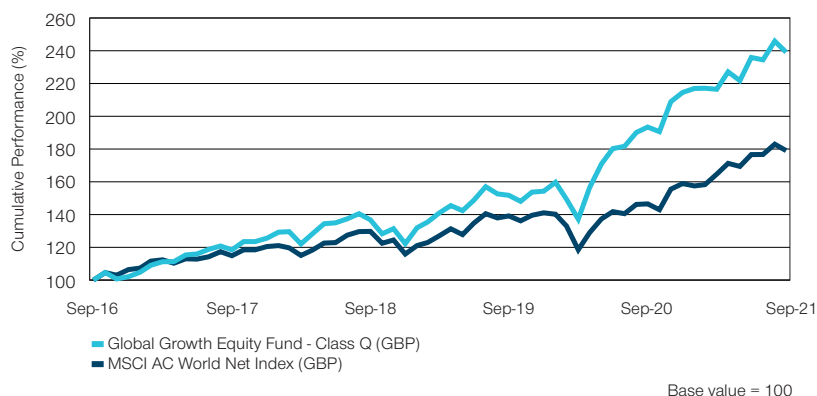

IMPORTANT INFORMATION
