

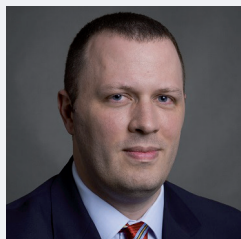

INVESTMENT OBJECTIVE

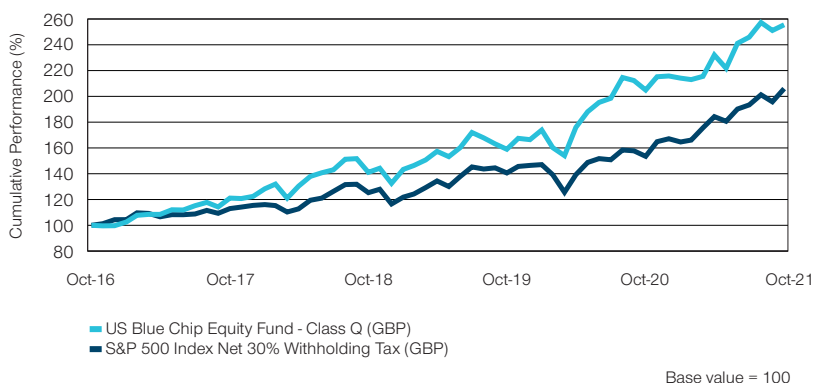
