## INVESTMENT OBJECTIVE AND STRATEGY

The fund seeks a high level of income consistent with minimal fluctuation in principal value and liquidity.

Invest in a diversified portfolio of short- and intermediate-term investment-grade corporate, government, and mortgage-backed securities.

May also invest in bank obligations, collateralized mortgage obligations, foreign securities, and hybrids.

Normally, the fund will invest at least 80% of its net assets in bonds.

The fund's average effective maturity will normally exceed three years.

## BENEFITS AND RISKS

The fund's income level should generally be above that of a money market fund but less than that of a long-term bond fund.

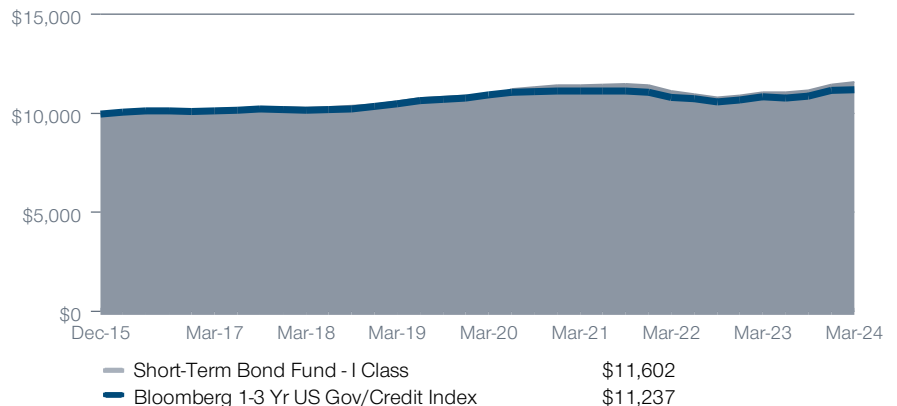
The fund's share price should fluctuate less than a longer-term bond fund.

The fund is subject to credit risk, liquidity risk, call risk, and interest rate risk. As interest rates rise, bond prices generally fall.

## Definitions

Beta: A measure of market risk of an investment option that shows how responsive the investment is to a given market index, such as the Standard & Poor's 500 Index. By definition, the beta of the benchmark is 1.00. An investment with a beta of 1.10 is expected to perform 10% better than the index in up markets and 10% worse in down markets. Usually, higher betas represent riskier investments. Figures are calculated using monthly data and are net of fees.

Morningstar rated the fund 3 and 3 stars among 534 and 494 Short-Term Bond funds for the 3- and 5-year periods (as applicable) ending 3/31/2024, respectively. The Morningstar Rating™ for funds, or "star rating", is calculated for funds with at least a three-year history. Exchange-traded funds and open-ended mutual funds are considered a single population for comparative purposes. It is calculated based on a Morningstar Risk-Adjusted Return measure that accounts for variation in a managed product's monthly excess performance, placing more emphasis on downward variations and rewarding consistent performance. The top 10% of products in each product category receive 5 stars, the next 22.5% receive 4 stars, the next 35% receive 3 stars, the next 22.5% receive 2 stars, and the bottom 10% receive 1 star.

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T. Rowe Price uses a custom structure for diversification reporting on this product.

Credit ratings for the securities held in the Fund are provided by Moody's, Standard & Poor's and Fitch and are converted to the Standard & Poor's nomenclature.

A rating of "AAA" represents the highest-rated securities, and a rating of "D" represents the lowest-rated securities. If the rating agencies differ, the highest rating is applied to the security. If a rating is not available, the security is classified as Not Rated (NR). T. Rowe Price uses the rating of the underlying investment vehicle to determine the creditworthiness of credit default swaps and sovereign securities. The Fund is not rated by any agency. U.S. Government Agency securities may include conventional pass-through securities and collateralized mortgage obligations. This category may include rated and unrated securities.

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
